Compensation: \$22 per hour (with a max of 20 hours per week) from January to May 2025. In June 2025, the position transitions to a full-time hourly position at \$45,000-

\$48,000 commensurate with experience.

Overview: The K-4 and Next Steps Manager's primary objective is to provide the vision and leadership for cohesive and progressive academy school year and summer programming for grades preK-4 and Next Steps - working with the Program Directors to ensure the curriculum is cohesive and progressive, and partnering with the Academy Manager to ensure best business practices. This person ensures the creation of a safe, welcoming, and inspiring environment for students, families and teachers. This position is expected to pursue professional development opportunities, grow in teaching abilities and strengthen the student experience through programming. Academy team members must be team players, lead by example, exhibit a strong work ethic and be committed to the Academy philosophy of teaching life skills through stage skills and transforming lives through theater.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

### Academy Programming

- Serve as Curriculum Director for K3-4 grade programming, researching and developing a progressive child-centered curriculum and classroom management strategies for Academy classes, in conjunction with Academy Director
- Support the Academy Director in administering and facilitating the Adjunct Professional Learning Community and professional development opportunities.

- In consultation with Academy Director, Academy Manager, and Artistic Director- Develop new programming and assess and maintain programming year round
- Recruit, supervise, develop and evaluate all K-4 and Next Steps faculty, curriculum and programming needs including coordination with production department on sensory friendly performances, in conjunction with Academy Director
- Work with the Academy Director and Academy Manager to maintain and develop programming for partner schools, grades K-4
- Teach and serve as a site coordinator during school year and summer, as needed
- o Maintain a clean and safe workspace

## General Academy

- o Maintain communication with Academy office and adjunct staff
- Work with Program Directors, Director of Artistic Inclusion, Artistic Director, Managing Director, and Academy Manager to execute the First Stage strategic plan
- Report on K-4/Next steps programming to First Stage Board of Directors when needed
- Sit on programming committees and facilitate Academy subcommittees as needed
- Communicate School Year Academy and Summer programming needs to other departments
- Serve as primary contact for K-4/Next Steps Academy programming, including media

### Academy Administration

- Work with Academy Manager and Director of Advancement to ensure completion and delivery of all school year brochures and marketing pieces
- Support Academy Manager and Advancement with regard to school year program evaluation.

## Artistic Duties

- o Participate in Artistic Team meetings and season planning.
- o Assist and advise during the audition and call-back process as needed.

## QUALIFICATIONS

- An MFA in Theater or a Master's in Education, with at least three years of management experience, is preferred but not required.
- Prior teaching experience in K3-5 grade and working with students on the Autism Spectrum is essential.
- Excellent communication and customer service skills are critical, along with the ability to adjust communications styles to varied youth, parent and professional populations.
- Proven Microsoft Office proficiency (Word, Excel, Power Point, etc); experience with a database system, is necessary.

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- Spanish-speaking abilities are a plus but not required.
- All staff members of First Stage must have the ability to pass a background check.
- Ability to maintain a positive work environment by communicating and behaving in a positive manner with all artists, staff, and stakeholders from a variety of backgrounds
